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Dear Instructor,

Please find enclosed application forms for the Irish Martial Arts Commission and a leaflet outlining the benefits of I.M.A.C. membership as requested.

Your completed application form will be forwarded to the designated IMAC Advisory Board of the System through which you are apply to join – or to the IMAC Executive if no appropriate IMAC Advisory Board currently exists. That Advisory Board (or Executive) may then contact you for further information or clarification based on the criteria for entry into that System. Some IMAC Advisory Boards have an additional annual membership fee.

The Advisory Board of each System is made up of elected representatives from within that System and, should your application be successful, your organisation will be given the opportunity to nominate a representative onto the Advisory Board

When your application has been processed by the N.G.B. their decision will be forwarded to the I.M.A.C. Executive Committee for their approval.

- If the decision of both bodies is positive, you will be informed that your application has been successful.
- If the decision of either body is negative, you will be offered the opportunity to put your case personally to the full Executive Committee (made up of two representatives from each of the I.M.A.C. Systems).
- The decision of the I.M.A.C. Executive Committee is final in regard to membership applications - pending an ultimate right of appeal to the next A.G.M.

Should your application be accepted, you will become a probationary member for a period of three years from the date of your application. During the period you will be able to take part in all I.M.A.C. business and debate, you will be entitled to avail of all I.M.A.C. publicity services but will not have voting rights. Thereafter, on the approval of the Executive Committee, you shall be deemed to be a full voting member of the I.M.A.C.

As part of the application process, and as a requirement under the National Vetting Bureau Act and Children First Act, all Instructors must undergo the IMAC National Vetting process. The required forms will be forwarded to each named Instructor, Assistant Instructor and Volunteer in your organization / club once your application has been endorsed by the IMAC Executive Committee.
